






Figure 2: DHE working concept of the EHDS


From Active and Healthy Ageing to Active and Healthy Living

 - Promote International Cooperation on AHA (**IDIH, EU-Japan, EU Canada**)

- AAL is a European programme funding innovation that keeps us connected, healthy, active and happy into our old age.


