- Orientati prevalentemente allo sviluppo e alle esigenze locali
- Bandi regionali o altre forme di affidamento su base nazionale

- **Fondi a gestione centrale**

(Es.: EUHP 2008-2013, VII RFP/PQR)

- Orientati prevalentemente alla cooperazione tra esperti/professionisti e alla creazione di network trans-nazionali
- Partnership obbligatoria (almeno 3 Stati membri)
- Valore aggiunto europeo (non repliche/gemmazioni di interventi locali)
- Bando europeo

- Fare esperienza del contesto europeo (in vista di un possibile scenario dell' offerta sanitaria)

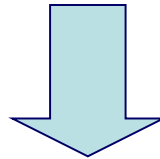
Scorrette:

Programmi Europei

Luci ed ombre partecipazione italiana - 1

- Ampia e qualificata partecipazione
- Incompleta conoscenza dei dettagli di mission e di funzionamento dei singoli programmi
- Scarsa capacità di “fare rete” tra i soggetti nazionali con maggiori chance
- Insufficiente coordinamento inter-istituzionale e tra le istituzioni e i candidati

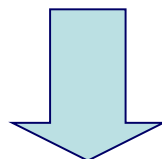


Percentuale di successo inferiore alle possibilità

Luci ed ombre partecipazione italiana - 2

- Scarsa correlazione tra priorità di intervento nazionali ed europee
- Limitato numero di italiani stabilmente inseriti nei contesti trans-nazionali
- Inserimento nei network europei di soggetti/organizzazioni poco rappresentative/influenti nel contesto nazionale
- Scarso trasferimento del “know how” dai soggetti partecipanti al resto del contesto
- Insufficiente pubblicizzazione dei risultati

Informazioni Generali

- Approvato con Decisione n. 1350/2007/CE del PE e Consiglio del 23 ottobre 2007
- Durata: 1 Gennaio 2008 – 31 Dicembre 2013
- Budget 2008-2013: 321,5 mln € (365,5 mln € per 2007-2013)
- 3 obiettivi → strand:
 - migliorare la sicurezza sanitaria dei cittadini,
 - promuovere la salute, anche riducendo le disparità sanitarie,
 - generare e diffondere informazioni e conoscenze sulla salute.

Meccanismi di finanziamento

- Co-finanziamento di progetti tesi al raggiungimento degli obiettivi del Programma → **“Call for proposal”**
- Finanziamento di azioni per il raggiungimento degli obiettivi del programma → **“Call for tender”**
- Co-finanziamento dei costi di funzionamento di ONG o reti specializzate → **“Operating Grants”**
- Finanziamenti “congiunti” tra Commissione e Stati Membri → le **“Joint Actions”**
- Co-finanziamento di Conferenze di livello europeo

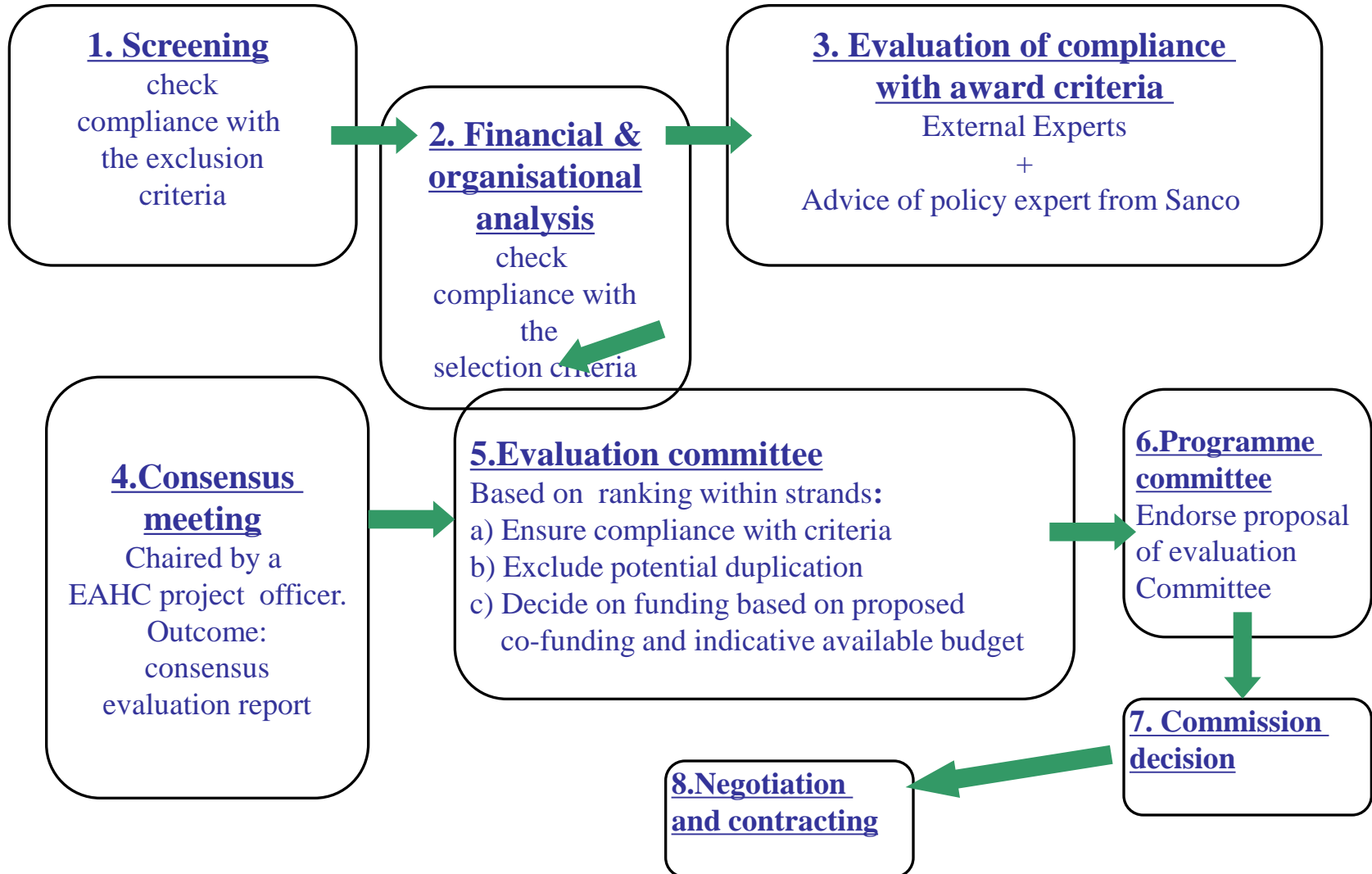

 - Pubblicazione fine gennaio - metà febbraio
 - Scadenza Seconda metà di maggio
- Commissione Europea - DGSANCO
Work Plan Annuale (budget e azioni finanziabili)
- EAHC (ex-PHEA) – Executive Agency for Health and Consumers
 - lancio call, infoday, assistenza pre-submission
 - valutazione, selezione, negoziazione
 - management authority
- Punti focali EAHC
 - Informazione al pubblico (National Infoday)
 - Contributo informale definizione Work Plan
 - Partnership search e assistenza candidati (dal 2009)

La “call for proposal” - regole generali

- Finanziamento:
 - 60% dei costi ammissibili,
 - max 80% per progetti con alto EVA (Valore Aggiunto Europeo)
- Paesi Ammissibili:
 - EU27
 - Paesi EFTA-EEA (Norvegia, Islanda e Liechtenstein)
 - Paesi della Politica di Vicinato
 - Paesi Candidati (Albania, Bosnia-Erzegovina, Croazia, Ex-Repubblica Jugoslava di Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia e Turchia)

Evaluation of proposals



Award Criteria: set out in the Work Plan 2010

- Always has to address 3 sets of elements:
 - Relationship with Community policies
 - Technical quality
 - Management quality

Policy and context relevance 1

- Contribution to the Health Programme and Annual Work Plan.
- Strategic relevance to existing knowledge and health status.
- Adequacy of the project with the social, cultural and political context in which it is implemented.

Policy and context relevance 2

- Added value at European level
 - impact on target groups, long term effect and potential multiplier effects such as replicable, transferable and sustainable activities
 - contribution to, complementing, synergy and compatibility with EU relevant policies

Policy and context relevance 3

- Pertinence of geographical coverage
 - In respect of the project's objectives, the role of eligible countries as partners and the relevance of project resources or target populations they represent.
 - National, sub-national or regional dimension proposals will be rejected.

Technical quality 1

- Evidence base
 - description of the problem analysis, the factors, the impact, the effectiveness and applicability of measures proposed
- Content specification
 - aims and objectives, target groups including relevant geographical factors, methods, anticipated effects and outcomes
- Innovative nature, technically complementing
 - avoidance of duplication of other existing actions at EU level

Technical quality 2

- Evaluation strategy
 - kind and adequacy of methods proposed and indicators chosen
- Dissemination strategy
 - adequacy of envisaged strategy and methodology proposed to ensure transferability of results and sustainability of the dissemination

Management quality & budget 1

- **Planning and organisation of the project**
 - description of activities, timetable and milestones, deliverables, nature and distribution of tasks, analysis of risk
- **Organisational capacity**
 - description of the management structure, staff competencies, responsibilities, internal communication, decision making, monitoring and supervision

Management quality & budget 2

- Quality of partnership
 - extensiveness, roles and responsibilities, relationships among the different partners, synergy and complementing project partners and network structure
- Communication strategy
 - planning, target groups, adequacy of channels used, visibility of EU co-funding

Management quality & budget 3

- Overall and detailed budget
 - it must be relevant, appropriate, balanced and consistent in itself, between partners and with the specific objectives of the project
 - it should be distributed within partners at a minimum reasonable level, avoiding excessive fragmentation
- Financial management
 - description of the financial circuits, responsibilities, reporting procedures and controls

New Funding Opportunities in Health: Call 2009

26 February 2009



The European Commission has published today the Work Plan for 2009 for the implementation of second programme of Community action in the field of health.

The publication of the Work Plan was followed by the calls for proposals. The Executive Agency for Health and Consumers (EAHC) published calls for proposals for projects, operating grants, conferences and joint actions.

The Calls present new funding opportunities for the European organisations active in the area of public health. The total budget available for the execution of the 2009 Work Plan is about 48.2 million euro.

All proposals should address important problems in the European public health and be in line with the Commission's priorities expressed in the Work Plan.

The successful proposals should concentrate on concepts of public health that

Health Programme



The Health Programme is the European Commission's main instrument for implementing the **EU health strategy**. The programme aims, through projects and other actions it funds, to improve the level of physical and mental health and well-being of EU citizens and reduce health inequalities throughout the Community.

In particular, the Programme supports health-promoting and preventive actions that address the major health determinants e.g., nutrition, physical activity, or smoking. The Health Programme is implemented in the form of annual work plans, which the European Commission adopts. The first Programme of Community action in the field of public health (2003-2008) financed over 300 projects and other actions
