Instrument of "Joint Action"

Joint financing of a public body or nongovernmental organisation by the Community and one or more Member States

Joint Action



Health Programme – Article 4 Financial contributions

Financial contributions by the Community may, where appropriate given the nature of the objective to be achieved, include joint financing by the Community and one or more Member States or by the Community and the competent authorities of other participating countries. In this case, the Community contribution shall not exceed 50 %, except in cases of exceptional utility, where the Community contribution shall not exceed 70 %. These Community contributions may be awarded to a public body or a non-governmental body, which is non-profit-making and independent of industry, commercial and business or other conflicting interests, and pursues as its primary goal one or more objectives of the Programme, designated through a transparent procedure by the Member State or the competent authority concerned and agreed by the Commission.



Partners

Proposals should provide a genuine **European**dimension in order to make sense both
technically and in terms of policy. Depending on
the scope of the action.



Who can participate in the Joint Action?

- Member States/other countries participating in the Health Programme, which wish to participate in joint actions must declare this intention to the Commission.
- Public bodies or non-governmental bodies based in a Member State or in other participating country of the EU Health Programme, which have expressed their interest to participate in the joint action.



Participation of NGO

- Designation:
 - national NGO: national authorities
 - EU umbrella NGO: European Commission
- Independence transparency
 - Additional requirement to fulfill the transparency criterion:
 <u>funding information to be available on the NGO's web-site</u>
- Independence financial
 - Applicant organizations must <u>unilaterally commit</u> not to receive more than 20% of their core funding from private sector organizations representing a conflicting interest / other sources representing a conflicting interest during the financial years covered by the grant



Joint Actions in HP 2008-2013

- 25 Joint Actions were funded from 2008-2012
 - 22 partners/JA in average
 - 80,4 M as total cost and 41,4 M EC- funding (50%)
 - Maximum: 2011 EUnetHTA JA 2 with 9,4 M and EC funding 6,6M
 - Minimum: 2010 MODE with with 0,58 M and EC funding 0,28 M






Total Budget vs EU co-funding






Coordinating Countries 2008-2011
