What it is

Technical tool designed to support Member States in strengthening their long-term care systems in line with the Council Recommendation on access to affordable high-quality long-term care

Structured approach to **develop an evidence base** that can support health and care system reforms and guide information system development

Facilitate **change management**, planning and transparency

What it is not

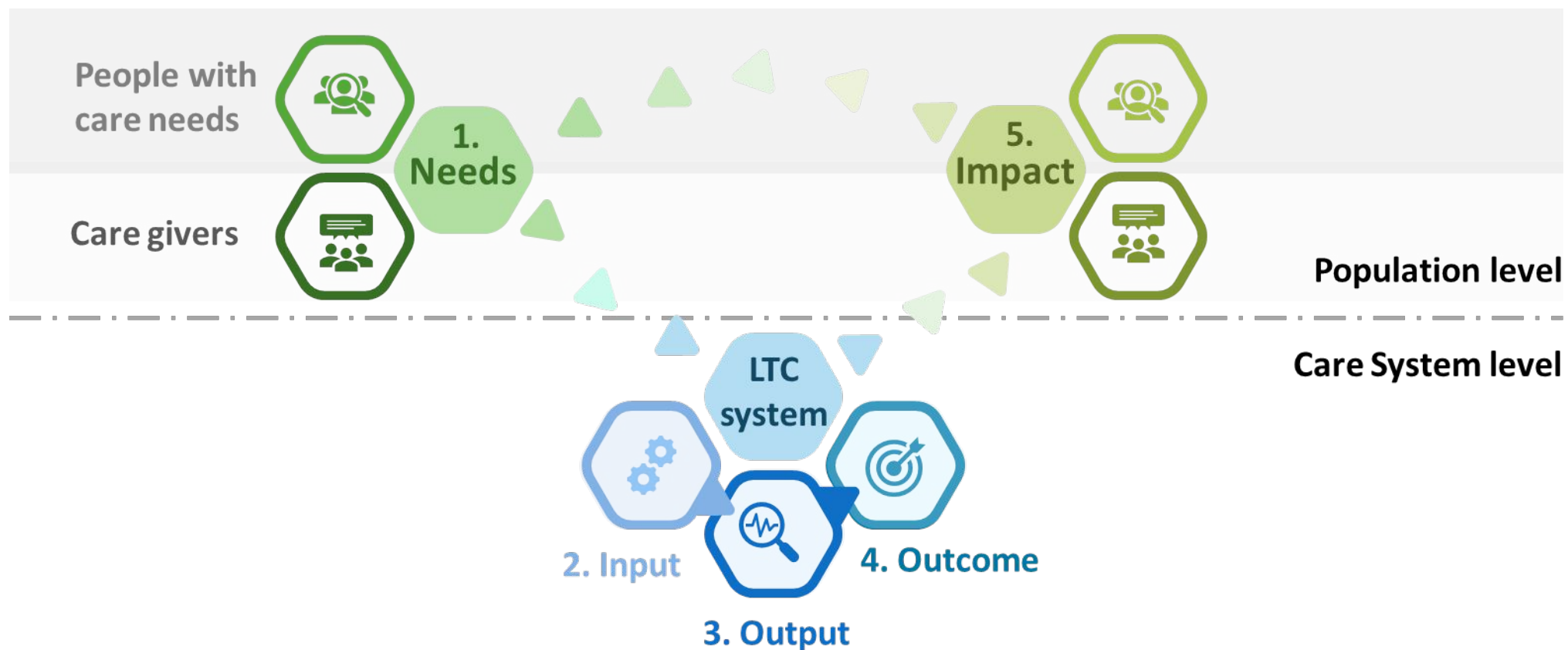
NOT a benchmarking tool – focus is on comparison through time not across countries

NOT a normative tool – will not output recommendations for action but will offer insights into levers for policy action to achieve a given outcomes

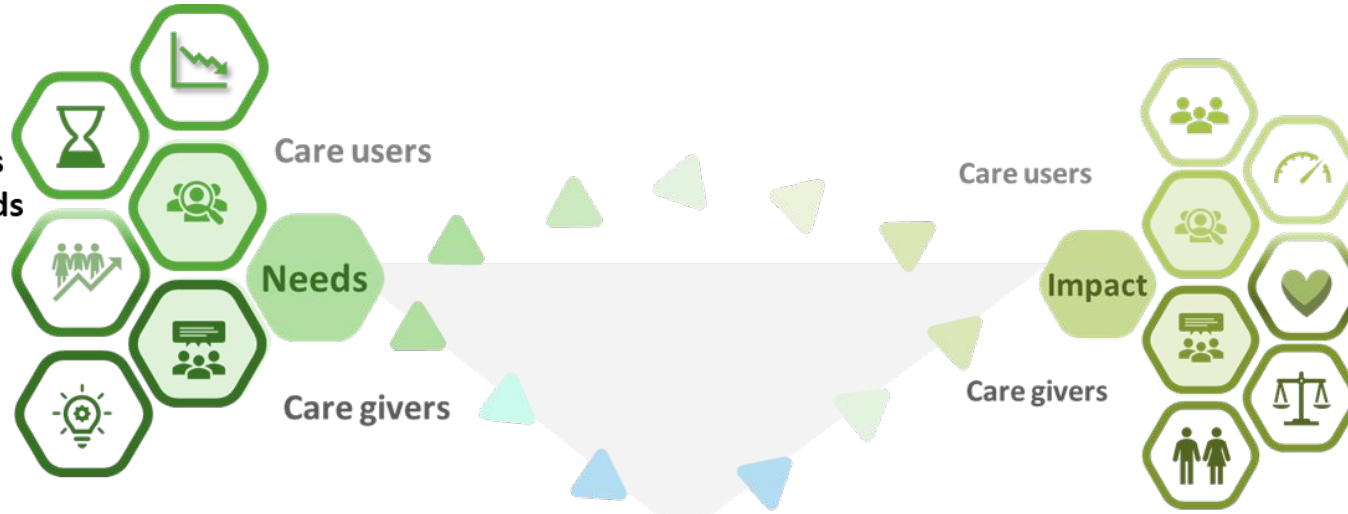
NOT a standardized assessment – focuses on offering a common structure within which each country can develop specific goals/ outcomes/ processes of interest

NOT an exhaustive evaluation of LTC systems – focused on informing decision-making and facilitating change

Structure for data collection

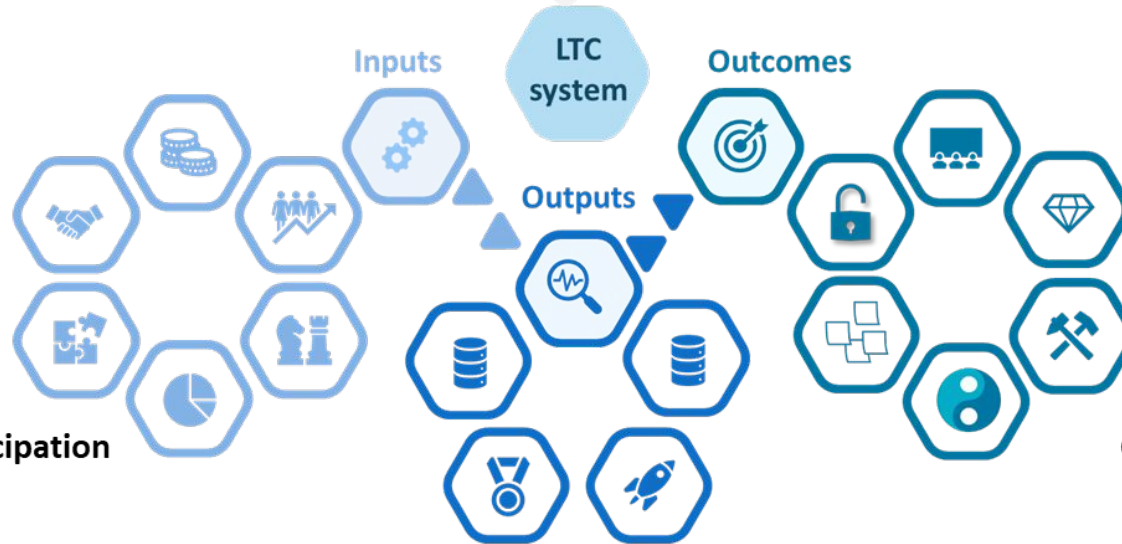


Prevalence of ADL/IADL limitations

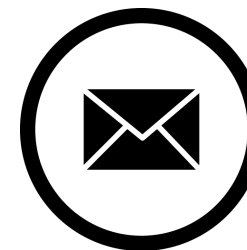
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
