


Who we are & what we do



How do we define synergies?

"Synergies encompass compatibility, complementarity and coherence among different forms of EU funding. This requires good interaction of two or more programmes aiming at enhancing the effects that could be achieved by individual interventions"*

Maximise the value, impact, efficiency of EU funding and deliver on EU priorities



Two main types of synergies

Synergies by design

 Foreseen at programming level (i.e. directly specified in the call text)

Synergies by implementation

 Promoted by the Agency to support a coherent project portfolio










How do synergies unfold?









Complementary funding: bringing together funding from different programmes or different levels in the same project

Sequential funding: successive projects that build on each other Alternative funding: taking up high-quality project proposals from other programmes (e.g. SoE) Complementarity of parallel projects
